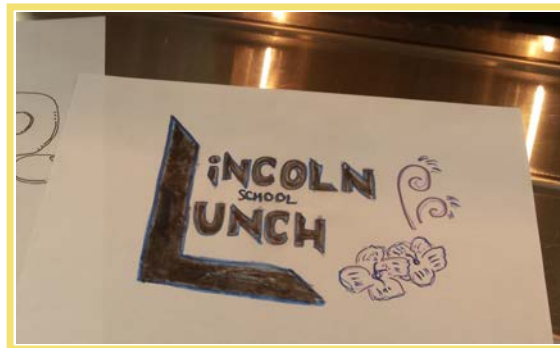
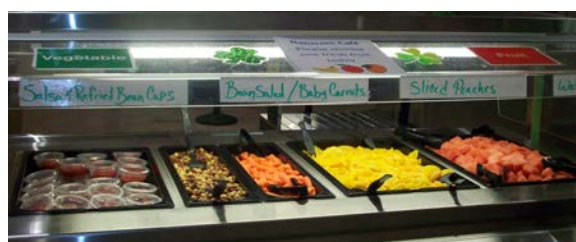


Massachusetts Smarter Lunchrooms Movement

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Smarter Lunchrooms Goals Completed:

- Whole fruit options are displayed in attractive bowls and baskets.
- Daily fruit options are written legibly on menu boards in all service and dining areas.
- All vegetable names are printed/written on name cards.
- White milk is placed in front of other beverages in all coolers.
- All targeted entrée names are written and legible on menu boards.
- Reimbursable "Combo Meal" pairings are promoted on signs and posters.
- Posters displayed healthful foods are visible and readable within all service and dining areas.
- All promotional signs and posters are rotated, updated or changed at least quarterly.
- Menu boards featuring today's meal components are visible and readable within all service areas.
- Cleaning supplies and utensils are returned to cleaning closet and not visible.
- Clutter is removed from service and dining areas promptly.
- Student groups are involved in creation of artwork promoting menu items.
- Signage/posters/floor decals are available to direct students toward all services areas.

Strategies Used to Complete Goals:

- Making items more visible and accessible
- Menu boards
- Signage on the line
- Pictures of food (on the line or on menu boards)
- Improved lunch atmosphere
- Involvement with students

Key Successes:

- Displaying menu boards: large, portable white boards that list the meal components and are placed in such a way that they are visible and readable within all service areas.
- Involving students in the creation of lunchroom artwork.
- Labeling each item with signage on the line.
